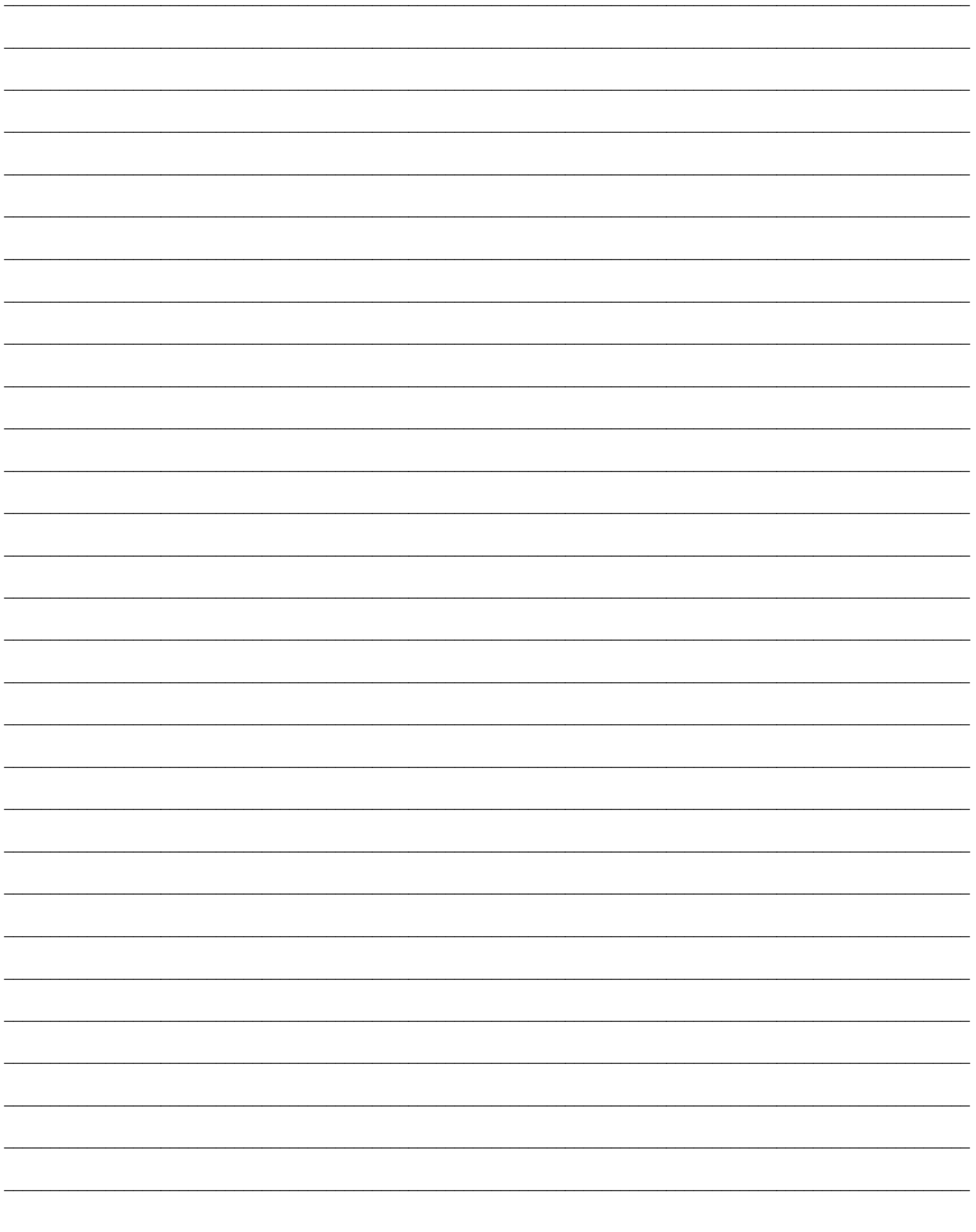
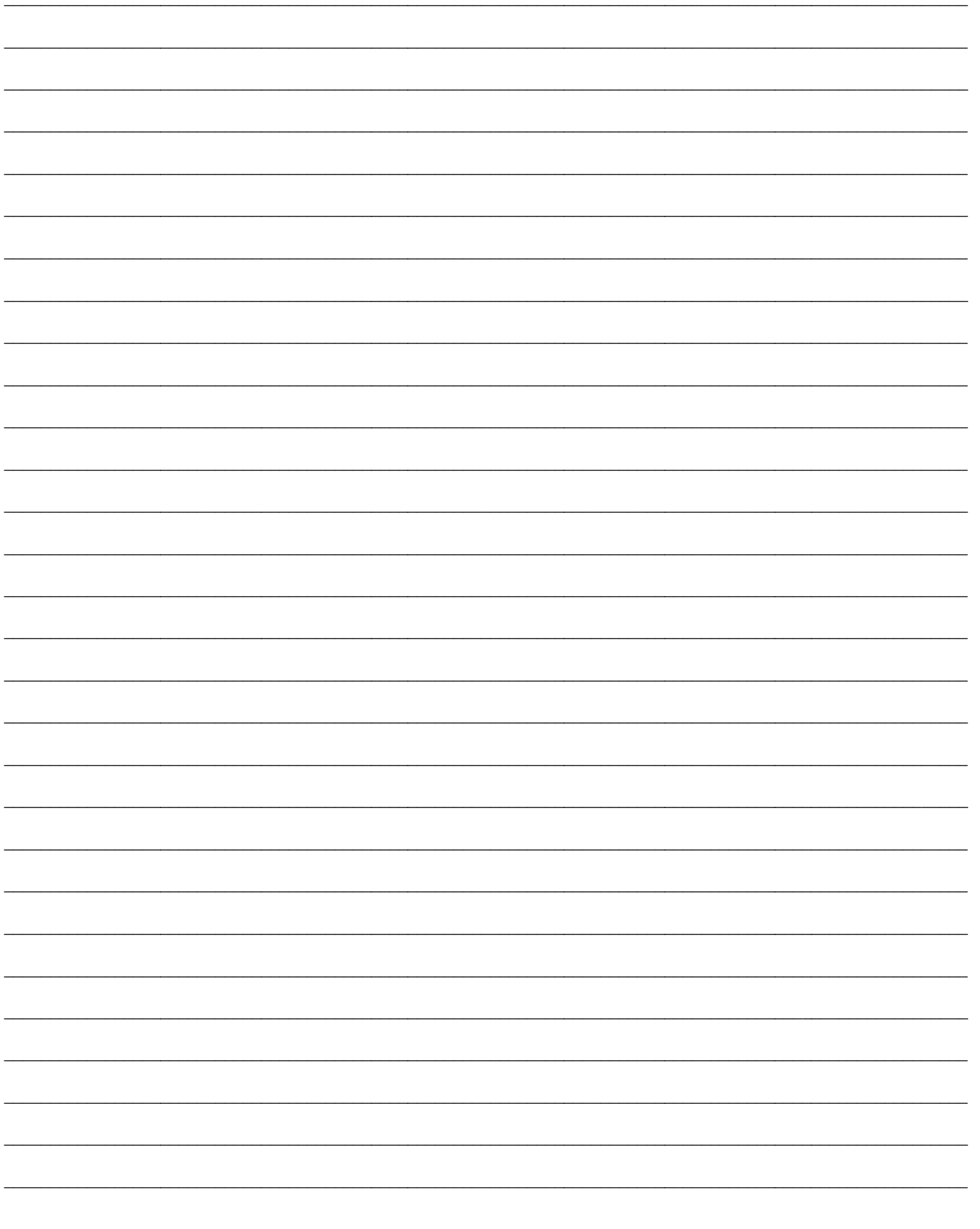

Performance Level Breakdown

Exceeding Expectations (EE): 17 – 20 Marks

The learner writes a very creative story with excellent flow, rich vocabulary, and almost no grammatical errors.

Meeting Expectations (ME): 11 – 16 Marks

The learner writes a clear story that is easy to follow. There are a few spelling or punctuation mistakes, but the meaning is clear.

Approaching Expectations (AE): 07 – 10 Marks

The learner writes a short story. There are several mistakes in grammar and spelling, and the flow is a bit disconnected.

Below Expectations (BE): 01 – 06 Marks

The learner struggles to form complete sentences or stay on topic. The work is difficult to read due to many errors.
